A fifth-generation Floridian from Alachua County, Sudye Cauthen founded the North Florida
Center for Documentary Studies, Inc. in 1997 after completing a M. A. in Southern Studies at the
University of Mississippi's Center for the Study of Southern Culture. In Florida, Cauthen has taught writing
in both Poetry- and Fiction-in-the-Schools as well as at the University of Central Florida, Florida State
University, and community colleges near her home on the Suwannee River at White Springs. Her writing
awards include two State of Florida Individual Artist Fellowships in Literature and a Glimmer Train award
for fiction. Her prizewinning poetry, fiction, and non-fiction have appeared in many publications, including
The Chattahoochee Review, Florida Review, International Quarterly, Kalliope, The Old Florida Journal,
and The New Encyclopedia of Southern Culture. Cauthen's first book, SOUTHERN COMFORTS: Rooted
in a Florida Place won a Florida Book Award. She is now at work completing a second memoir, All The
Pretty Cattle, and The Place of Our Remembrance, a documentary work incorporating oral histories and
interviews. A book of fiction, THE SALVATION OF MAGGIE RIDER: Stories from Nokofta, was
published in 2010.
